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SUMMER FOOD SERVICE PROGRAM

STARTING JUNE 7TH, 2021

Norton City Schools is participating in the Summer Food Service Program. Meals will be provided to all children without charge and are the same for all children regardless of race, color, national origin, sex, age or disability, and there will be no discrimination in the course of the meal service. Meals will be provided on a first come, first serve basis at the following site and times:

Norton Elementary and Middle School: Breakfast 8:30am to 9:00am Lunch 11:30am to 12:30pm

John I. Burton High School: Breakfast 8:30am to 9:00am Lunch 11:30am to 12:30pm

Breakfast and lunch meals will be provided from June 7th to June 24th, Monday through Thursday at both schools. Starting June 28th – July 22nd, lunch will be the only meal provided at John I. Burton High School, Monday thru Thursday. After June 24th there will be no meals served at Norton Elementary and Middle School. From July 5th to July 8th, no meals will be served that week.
